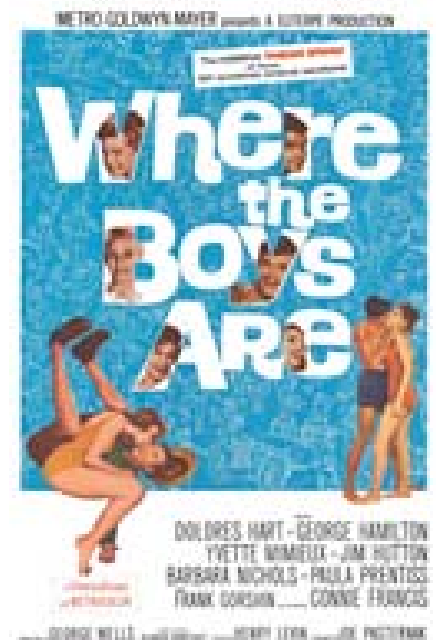

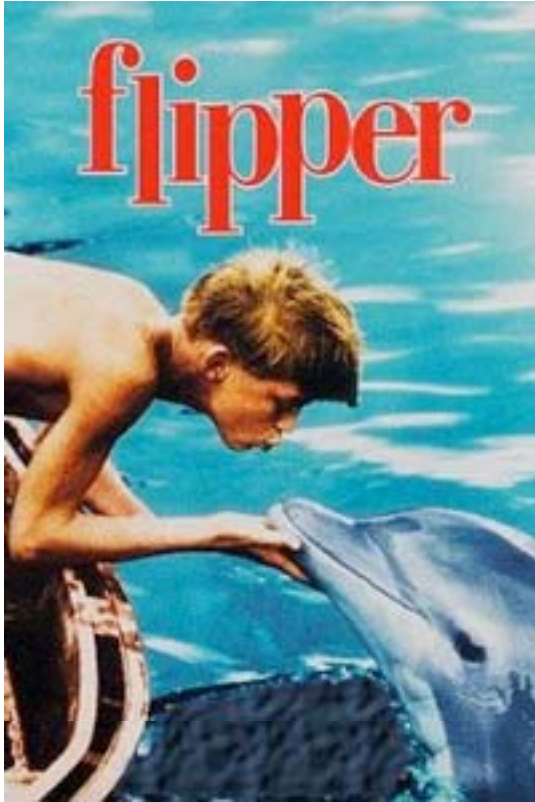
Key Biscayne

It's the story about a boy and a dolphin...story that went on to lay the foundation for the famous TV show to follow...



The Florida Keys have been hit by hard times of late. A red plague kills off much of the fish in the area. Hurricane Hazel unexpectedly changes course to hit the Keys. Regardless, the Ricks family - fisherman father Po (short for Porter, played by Chuck Connors), wife Martha (Kathleen Maquire), their preteen son Sandy (Luke Halpin), and Sandy's pet pelican Pete - live in all its aspects by the sea, even during these hard times. When Sandy witnesses the accidental spearing of a dolphin, he, on his own, decides to tow the dolphin home. With some care and love, Sandy and Martha nurse the dolphin back to health. Sandy wants to keep the dolphin, who he's named Flipper, but Po ultimately releases Flipper, who he sees as "the enemy": a creature who is on the hunt for whatever short supply of fish might still be around the Keys. But in the end, Po learns that friends - what Flipper and Sandy are to each other - help each other unconditionally.

Ned Racine (William Hurt) is a single, sleezy lawyer with a penchant for chasing women in a small Florida town. During an intense heat wave, Ned meets married Matty Walker (Kathleen Turner) at the town's band shell during an outdoor concert. The heat generated between these two is immediate and a steaming affair begins. Their only challenge is her husband, mob-connected Edmund Walker (Richard Crenna), whose wealth adds fuel to their plot to eliminate him. Peter Lowenstein (Ted Danson), Ned's buddy and the town prosecutor, warns Ned (to no avail) about the potential for trouble with Matty. Ned enlists the assistance of Teddy Lewis (Mickey Rourke), a local arsonist and former client in the scheme. The crime initiates a dizzying chain of events which spiral toward an unbelievable ending.
